Bach Flower Remedies

Bach flower remedies (BFRs) are solutions of brandy and water—the water containing extreme dilutions of flower material developed by Edward Bach, an English homeopath, in the 1930s. Bach claimed that the dew found on flower petals retained imagined healing properties of that plant. It is said that he discovered 38 such remedies. Systematic clinical trials of Bach flower solutions have found no efficacy beyond a placebo effect.

The solutions contain a 50:50 mix of water and brandy and are called mother tincture. Stock remedies, the solutions sold in shops, are dilutions of mother tincture into other liquids. Most often the liquid used is alcohol, so the alcohol level by volume in most stock remedies is between 25 and 40%. The solutions are usually further diluted before use, typically into a treatment bottle that contains two drops of one or more stock remedies in water. The solutions do not have a characteristic scent or taste of the plant because of dilution. The dilution process results in the statistical likelihood that little more than a single molecule may remain; it is claimed that the remedies contain energetic or vibrational nature of the flower and that this can be transmitted to the user. The solutions are described as vibrational medicines, which implies they rely on the pseudoscientific concept of water memory. They are often labelled as homeopathic, but are not really homeopathy as they do not follow other homeopathic ideas such as the "law of similars".

There is also the Treasure Hunt coming up on 3 July, see p8 for details.

Red kites have again been seen over Woodtown, in early April, and in our garden, in the last 3 weeks, there have been chiff-chaffs, black cap, bull finches and willow warblers. All signs that spring is here and summer must be getting closer.

Also the house martins have just appeared. Seems like only 2 pairs at the moment but they are already checking out the condition of their old nests.

Slow Down - Cattle Crossing

lan and I (Cath), along with our team, are dairy farming at West Webbery Farm. I'm sure many of you will have been held up whilst the cows were crossing the road so we feel it only right to firstly thank you all for your patience with this, but also to let you know what's happening on the farm. We milk 350 cows and through the spring these are run as 2 groups, the high yielders and the low yielders. It's probably the low yielders you have seen crossing the road. We also have a further 180 head of youngstock who are our future herd, having their first calf and producing their first milk aged 2. We like to calve the entire herd in as tight a window as possible from the beginning of August. Due to TB, our calving block is a little longer than we'd like this year but we will be finished by the end of October. This Autumn block calving system allows us to focus our management at particular times of year. This is key to the success of our business, forcing us to focus on critical profit drivers for any dairy farm, especially fresh cow health and fertility, production of high quality forage and heifer rearing.

At this time of year, we are trying to produce as much milk as we can from grass and a small amount of concentrate in the milking parlour. To do this, we give the cows fresh grass after every milking and we need them to graze it down tight, so the regrowth is high quality. Every bite counts and so we reseed a few fields each year to maximise productivity. This is the cheapest way to produce milk and with the current dip in milk price it's essential to keep our costs down. We enjoy seeing the cows at grass too. It's also silage time. We cut every 5 weeks from the end of April/start of May. In June we start drying off. The cows stop milking and have a 6-8 week holiday ahead of their due date, before the cycle begins again. So for now, we welcome the warm weather and the odd heavy downpour to keep the grass growing and the cows happy.
