Update from Assistant Chief Constable Glen Mayhew

Demands on Devon & Cornwall Police, and the police service in general, are back to pre-COVID levels, making it even more important that people respect the change in the law and take personal responsibility.

I hope that we do not need to enforce the latest legislation as people understand the importance of the measures to keep us all safe.

The pandemic has not gone away and everyone must play their part to protect themselves, their families and our communities.

I know we are seeing large numbers of younger people returning to universities in our region and campus life is likely to be very different with these latest measures. The work of universities and student groups to prepare for the year ahead highlights how we can all adapt. But I would ask everyone to respect yourself, others and comply with the law to make Devon and Cornwall a safe place for all."

If members of the public are concerned that the law is being broken or they are experiencing anti-social behaviour, they can report this to Devon and Cornwall Police. We will consider the most appropriate response and will target the most problematic behaviour. 

Riding on top of a wave on a bodyboard is one thing. Walking on top of the waves is another! The bible tells us that it was no problem for Jesus... as you might expect for the Son of God. But the bible tells us that there is one other person in history who has managed it – Peter. NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING FOR THE CHURCH OF ST MARY MAGDALENE HUNTSHAW

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting will be held on Thursday, 15th October 2020, 8 pm at the church

The agenda will be posted on the church notice board before 30th September and will include the election of church wardens, representatives to the Deanery Synod and the Parochial Church Council. The future of the church will be the first item on the agenda.

As you will know there have been no services in church since March. We have also not kept up our payments to the diocese of $\pounds 61$ per month. These payments are our contribution to our share of a priest and other Diocesan support. The absence of services and defaulting on payments to the Common Fund has serious implications for the future of the church. Regrettably, the time has come to consider the future. The PCC urge you to attend the AGM to let us know what you want from your church and what you are willing to contribute. The options are to:

- continue as a parish and build a worshipping community in the current building
- continue as a parish and become a festival church *
- become part of another parish and become a chapel of ease **
- become part of another parish, close the building and sell it, possibly to a community trust set up to look after the building

* Becoming a Festival Church means that we can provide a flexible approach to its use including hosting services of worship as and when we want to e.g. celebrating Christmas, Easter, Harvest Festival, Remembrance Day. At the same time, we would continue to broaden the building's use as a community resource by putting on cultural, educational and social events

** Becoming a Chapel of Ease would mean that a new united parish would take responsibility for the church in Huntshaw. Alverdiscott is an example of a Chapel of Ease with the Friends group managing fundraising events for care of the building.
