The end result of this inspection is to award each establishment a star rating, similar to hotels, from a 1 star to a 5 star rating, with 1 being just about acceptable and 5 being the best available.

As we start our 19th year here it is official recognition that we are at the forefront of kenneling in the area, with our knowledge, care and genuine love for the animals entrusted to us. It also means that our customers can be confident that their best friend will be offered a service that is second to none.

Bright Nights

Solving 'Bright Nights'

On ordinary moonlit nights the landscape is often impenetrably dark, exactly what you'd expect from a rural setting with little light pollution. On Bright Nights, moonlit or not, we sometimes get this remarkable light that suffuses the landscape, clear and strong and non-directional. You can see just as clearly under the trees as you can in the middle of a field.

The first time we noticed one of these Bright Nights there was no moon, but deep shadows sharply defined the land anyway. Everything was silvered with a strange, pale, milky glow. It was cloudy and the light seemed to radiate from the earth, not the sky. We could literally see for miles, see every detail.

Apparently the earliest account of Bright Nights comes from the Roman commander Pliny the Elder in AD 77, so they've been a mystery for a very long time. In 1909 a student in the Netherlands measured the total amount of starlight reaching earth and found a discrepancy on Bright Nights. He poetically named the phenomenon 'earthlight'. The 1800s saw still-mysterious Bright Nights called 'luminous smog'.

Finally, in the late 1980s, Gordon Shepherd of York University in Toronto found that the air waves rolling through earth's atmosphere sometimes pile up into vast towers of pressurised air, which affect the quality of light. He also found the sun's UV radiation splits molecular oxygen into atoms, which join up again at sunset. Together they create something an awful lot like a Bright Night, an 'airglow' that varies dramatically from night to night, place to place.

Shepherd's studies reveal there are Bright Nights all over the world, 7% of the time at any given place, as many as 25 a year, some brighter than others. What many once thought was rare is actually quite common, mainly because 99% Europeans sleep under an artificially lit sky whose subtleties are completely hidden. We're lucky. Isn't it fantastic that we have so little light pollution in the Parish?



Update from the Huntshaw Friends 20th March 2019

We have had a good start to 2019 with more grant awards and progress with essential repairs to the church. The contract for carrying out the work to the tower has been awarded to Kilbride Roofing Ltd, a Tiverton-based company. Josh Kilbride and his team are due to start the work at the end of June when the scaffolding will be erected. Work will continue through much of the summer however we will be able to use the church during this time. Funding for the work has been provisionally granted by the Coastal Recycling Community Fund who have generously awarded \pounds 25,000 (subject to a Faculty being granted and contracts being signed)

As we have several species of bats in the church, we have been working closely with Orbis Ecology from Dawlish who have implemented an ongoing survey. Special measures will be put into place should any bats be found during the work and an Orbis representative will be on site.

A lot of 'behind the scenes' work is going on regarding restoration of the bells. A fundraising plan has been developed and specialist bell restorers have visited and advised us on what is required. The bells will have to be removed and transported to Loughborough for the restoration work.

Our grateful thanks go to Allchurches Trust who have generously awarded a grant of $\pounds 1,500$ which will be put towards the cost of repair work to the pew platform at the rear of the nave. Allchurches Trust is one of the UK's largest grant-making charities. Their grants further their charitable objectives of promoting the Christian faith and other charitable causes. A further grant for $\pounds 4,000$ has been awarded from the Devon Historic Churches Trust which will also go towards carrying out the pew repairs. The Devon Historic Churches Trust is dedicated to funding repairs and maintenance to places of Christian worship. We are very grateful to the Trust for making this generous award and will continue to support them through our annual Ride and Stride event in September. And we must not forget an award of $\pounds 1,000$ from the Bideford Bridge Trust. Our thanks to the Trust.

And it is not only grants that we have been awarded. Thank you to Grow Wild who have awarded us a Wild Flower Seed Kit. As part of our eco-friendly churchyard we will be using the kit to create a patch of wild flowers that we hope will attract bees and butterflies. Grow Wild is a national outreach initiative of the_Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew and is supported by the The National Lottery Community Fund. Enthused by this award we have now applied for a Fungus Laboratory from Grow Wild.
