#### **Yeast Buns**

At the recent Flower Show I was asked for the recipe of my 'Yeast Buns'! This is not an easy task as I have no official recipe, it is just something that has evolved over the years! So this is the approximate ingredients. But it is not critical to use exact quantities - they seem to turn out ok however much I use - so good luck.

1.5 kilo bag of strong white bread flour (S'bury's).

Approx. 6 ozs of white sugar.

Approx. 6 ozs hard margarine (cut into cubes).

3 sachets of fast action dried yeast.

A little salt.

Approx. 2.5 pints of half cold milk and half hot water.

Approx. 8 ozs sultanas.

I sometimes add about 8 ozs of strong wholemeal flour.

I use a Kenwood Major Mixer, but if you have a smaller one or mix it by hand divide the quantities I've given.

#### Method if using a mixer.

Put all the ingredients in a mixing bowl except the liquid and sultanas. Mix for about 20 seconds to distribute the yeast, then gradually add the warmed liquid (you may not need it all depending on the flour, it can vary) it should be an elastic dough, not too wet, lastly add the sultanas and mix for about 20 seconds. Turn the dough onto a floured surface and knead well, working the sultanas into the centre, add a few more if you like plenty! The more you knead the better they are. Roll out to about half an inch thick and use the size cutters you like, then put on greased trays, cover with clean tea towels and leave them in a warm place until doubled in size. (Knead all the trimmings together and cut out more buns). Cook in a fairly hot oven until nice and brown, cool on cake racks and when they are completely cold, put in the freezer, when thawed they are just like freshly baked!

**If you make them by hand** - rub the margarine into the flour before adding the other ingredients. If these instructions seem daunting, give me ring on 858284 and make an appointment to come and watch me make some!!!

#### **Update from the Huntshaw Friends**

Well the first phase of the internal work at Huntshaw Church began in earnest at the end of July and within two days the floorboards in the vestry and the pew area had been removed. Beneath the pews we found ventilation channels leading out to the exterior of the walls of the building (like a Roman hypocaust system). The foundations in the vestry were damp and the floorboards and joists were so decayed that they had crumbled and no longer existed. This explains why those of us who had previously been brave enough to enter the vestry used to "bounce" as we walked! New oak joists have been placed in both areas and new floorboards laid. We plan to open up the old fireplace in the vestry and hopefully get some ventilation down the chimney. Also, for the first time in 40 years the vestry door is usable. It had been secured with an ancient lock for many years and the key was missing so a new lock is now in place and yesterday I had the pleasure of walking from the vestry into the churchyard.

In tandem with the pew and the vestry work, the west door to the church is being restored. This door is hundreds of years old but it is not the original door and there is a story to tell about this but that is for another edition of the LR. We were aware, however, that there was no frame to the doorway, so the door never fitted allowing in drafts and the cold. It was also prone to wobbling on its pintles! So, a new oak frame is being made and the door has been removed to a workshop for restoration. We have had problems with the external metal work as the hinge ends were worn and did not fit the pintles. Rather than getting new iron work made (at great expense) we enlisted the help of a retired blacksmith from Bideford. He has done some clever things to the hinges and made new pintles to fit so we are just waiting for the door to be rehung now. In the meantime the plywood looks very nice and it is keeping the weather out.
