For Christmas I was given the book A Cheesemongers Guide to the British Isles. It's proving a fascinating read, telling the history of how cheesemaking developed in the UK in the context of wider historical developments.

Apparently cheesemaking took significant steps forward in the early medieval period in the monasteries. These great institutions had the resources to experiment and experiment they did. Monasteries were not just places of prayer, but centres of learning and economic hubs, with a surprising amount of interaction across the continent of Europe.

Monasteries were at the forefront of scientific experimentation and discovery. Behind this endeavour was a belief that the world was made according to God's purpose and plan. Science was a means to discover more about that world, and its creator, and harness the resources of the world for the good of humankind.

I find it sad that so many people today seem to think that there is a conflict between science and faith, when the two should compliment each other. It's a simplification, but science can help us understand how the world works and faith why it is that way and the point to it all.

Not too long ago, when it was still possible to meet in person, I ran an Alpha course, to help people explore the Christian faith. One participant had for years assumed that he could never be a Christian because he believed in science. It was a revelation to him to discover that it was quite possible to do both. And indeed, many of the great scientists of our day are people of faith, including Francis Collins who led the human genome project and has been working on the USA's response to Covid. Interestingly Francis Collins became a Christian when he realised that he was a scientist, who relied on open minded inquiry for his work and yet he had dismissed Christianity without ever exploring it properly for himself. An honest and open inquiry led to his accepting the truth of Christianity and his commitment to Jesus.

Science can neither prove nor disprove Christianity. Scientists will differ in their views of faith. But if you have never seriously explored the claims of Jesus, my encouragement is to do so. Watching the Alpha course videos on YouTube is a great way of getting started. And the great thing is, you can do it during Covid from the comfort of your own home - maybe with a glass of wine and some cheese...



CV19 Update from Devon County Council Newsletter - 14 January

Think twice before leaving home

Devon's Director of Public Health, Steve Brown, <u>has called on us all to be extravigilant in following the Government's COVID-19 lockdown rules, and to "think twice" before we leave our homes.</u>

This follows a stark warning from the Chief Medical Officer, Professor Chris Whitty, that the next few weeks will be "the worst" of the pandemic for the NHS, and that the UK will go through the "most dangerous time" in the weeks before the vaccination rollout has an impact.

Vaccine scam warning

Trading Standards is warning the public to be on their guard following reports that fraudsters are sending out fake texts offering a COVID-19 vaccine in an attempt to steal bank details.

The text offers a link to what police call an "extremely convincing" fake NHS website.

Once on the website people are asked to input their bank details to register for a vaccine.

The scam message reads; 'we have identified that you are eligible to apply for your vaccine' and then prompts you to click on a link for further information or to 'apply' for the vaccine.

If you receive a text or email that asks you to click on a link or for you to provide information, such as your name, credit card or bank details, **delete it immediately.**

Remember, the NHS will never ask for your payment details.

• COVID-19 Fund launched to help communities

Devon County Council has launched its third round of COVID-19 funding to help provide valuable financial support to organisations working in communities that have been affected by the coronavirus outbreak.

The scheme sees grants of up to £700 available.
