In 2018, Ian and Michael were reflecting on the heritage of the business and decided to try supplying households around Bideford, Torrington and Barnstaple with bespoke fresh fruit and veg boxes. The business went from strength to strength, and necessitated the growing of more produce and adding additional product lines, as well as expanding the delivery area further across north Devon.

After much thought they then decided to open a farm shop, on-site at the farm in Woodtown. So, on Monday 2nd November 2020, the shop became a reality. The idea proved to be a good one and the shop did well. Since then Darren Manley has joined the team. Darren brought with him a vast amount of experience in traditional local butchery. The farm shop stocks a wonderful array of meats, vegetables, salads, fruit, dairy and eggs, as well as ice-cream from Tennacott Farm, and Blackwells Pasties of Bideford.

If you haven't yet paid them a visit, then I recommend that you do, soon.

I can personally vouch for the quality of the meat and vegetables, and the pasties aren't bad either! Here we have a local success story that deserves our support.

From the Rector Rev Gary Owen - 01769 560792 Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

This the cry that will echo through our churches on Easter morning. But is it true? Did Jesus really rise from the dead on the first Easter morning? And does it really matter anyway?

Whilst there is no doubt that Jesus existed (there are too many non-Christian contemporaries of Jesus who wrote about him) many people have sought to explain away the resurrection. Let's look at a few:

- Jesus never really died he just fainted and revived in the cool of the tomb. But Roman soldiers were experts at crucifixion and people didn't survive. There is no other record of someone simply fainting and reviving.
- Jesus' disciples stole Jesus' dead body and hid it to fake the resurrection. But the Roman governor Pilate had the tomb guarded by soldiers to make sure this didn't happen.
- Jesus did die and remained dead in the tomb the women who discovered the empty tomb went to the wrong one. But the women had seen Jesus laid in the tomb on the Friday and are unlikely to make a mistake about something so important.
- Jesus' disciples were so traumatised by Jesus' death that they hallucinated about seeing him alive. But would lots of people have had the same hallucination and these were tax collectors and fishermen not prone to flights of fancy!

There is also positive evidence for the resurrection: the many appearances of Jesus over forty days, the transformation of the disciples from a defeated rabble to courageous witnesses prepared to die for their belief in a risen Jesus. There is the testimony of billions of people over the last 2000 years that Jesus is alive and real to them.

But what does it matter whether Jesus died and rose again? After all, these events took place over two thousand years ago. Put simply, if Jesus rose from the dead, then it proves him to be who he claimed to be: the Son of God, and we may therefore take seriously everything he said and did. We can believe that it is through him that we can find a relationship with the living God and enjoy eternal life for ever. We can enjoy a relationship with him today.

A Message from Helen Bolton

I became a Parish Councillor in October 2019 because I hoped to make a difference; the Council was falling short of many of the protocols required as a properly functioning Parish Council, e.g. no website, failure to deal properly with planning applications, insufficient transparency etc., and I was keen to work towards properly representing the interests of the local community and addressing local issues and concerns. Councillor Goldstone was co-opted at the same time and we shared similar views and objectives.

Unfortunately any efforts to address these issues was frequently ignored or opposed and it became apparent that existing Councillors and the Parish Clerk did not share our enthusiasm to 'put things right'. 2020 was a particularly bad year for the Council; lockdown made it necessary to undertake meetings using 'Zoom' and this was bitterly opposed by the rest of the Council and several meetings were boycotted as a result. Later in the year it became apparent that the total inefficiency of the Council **in the two years preceding our co-option** meant that failure to meet the strict financial disclosures and send completed financial statements in time resulted in fines totalling almost £1,400 – a vast amount in relation to our precept of £4,180!

The final straw took place at meetings in March 2020, November 2020 and January 2021 when the same excellent candidate applied for co-option onto the Council and was enthusiastically supported by parishioners, several who spoke in the public session and 12 more who sent emails supporting her application. Despite this massive show of support from what is a large percentage of parishioners from this tiny hamlet, on each occasion an opposing candidate was co-opted in her stead! This failed candidate would have been the only member of the Council living in Huntshaw and was eminently suitable and very well qualified for the role. As it is now, of the five Councillors supposed to be representing Huntshaw I am the only one who actually lives in the Parish. Three of the remaining four actually work for Staines Trailers, a local Company who are known for openly flouting Planning Laws and whos' business is creating intolerable living conditions for other local residents, and they all live in other Parishes. The fourth lives in the Parish of St. Giles in the Wood. I find I cannot accept the way these co-options were corruptly
