Common Sense – An Obituary

Today we mourn the passing of an old friend, **Common Sense.** He had been with us for many years. No one knows for sure how old he was, since his birth records were long ago lost in bureaucratic red tape. He will be remembered as having cultivated such valuable lessons as:

1. Knowing when to come in out of the rain. 2. Why the early bird gets the worm. 3. That Life isn't always fair, and 4. OK, maybe it *was* my fault.

It declined even further when schools were required to get parental consent to administer sun lotion or an aspirin but could not inform parents when a student became pregnant and wanted to have an abortion.

Common Sense lost the will to live as churches became businesses and criminals received better treatment than their victims. Common Sense took a real beating when you couldn't defend yourself from a burglar, in your own home, and the burglar could sue you for assault.

Common Sense finally gave up the will to live after a customer failed to realise that a steaming cup of coffee was hot, spilled a little in their lap and was promptly awarded a huge settlement. Common Sense was preceded in death by his parents: Truth and Trust. By his wife: Discretion. By his daughter: Responsibility, and by his son: Reason.

He is survived by his 5 stepbrothers: I know my rights; I want it now; Someone else is to blame; I'm a victim and, Pay me for doing nothing. Not many attended his funeral because so few realised he was gone. If you still remember him, pass this on. If not, join the majority and do nothing...

It's been a real joy to resume weddings in church. So many of the weddings booked for 2020 had to be postponed. The first few weddings of this year have taken place with limits on the numbers attending and the wearing of face masks. Couples have been very inventive. One couple supplied blue masks to those on the groom's side and pink for those on the bride's.

A church wedding is special for many reasons and not just the beauty of the building. The traditional vows enable couples to make solemn yet joyful promises deep from the heart. Offering God's blessing on a couple as they are united in marriage and the whole congregation praying for them surely gives a husband a wife the best start to married life.

There is of course plenty of opportunity for each couple to 'customise' their wedding and make it their own. We always let couples chose their own bible reading. Many opt for I Corinthians 13, in which St Paul talks about the nature of love. You may well be familiar with the words: "love is patient, love is kind, it does not ..."

These words, apt as they are for a wedding, were not written primarily for couples getting married, but to a church struggling to live out the Christian life in the context of a permissive, licentious society. Society was urging people to chase their dreams and to seek personal fulfilment. St Paul said to love others by putting their good before your own.

The most famous verse of the bible, John 3.16 says, "for God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him might not perish but have eternal life." God is a God who shows his love by giving of himself for others. Paul encourages Christians to love in the same way. This is the recipe for building happy and fulfilling marriages... and it's also the recipe for building successful families, communities and societies.

I pray that all this year's wedding couples might enjoy long and happy marriages; with their love being not just a blessing for themselves but overflowing to those around them. I pray too that as churches and communities we might look to Jesus to learn what it means to love and show that love to those around us.

Did you know that recent changes in marriage law mean that:

- When a marriage takes place in church, clergy now supply details of the wedding (signed by the couple and witnesses) to the government's registration service for inclusion in a digital database.
- Mothers' names and occupations can now be recorded in the marriage register along with fathers.
- Couples can apply for a marriage certificate from the registration service.

Other rules relating to marriage in church remain the same.
