

ALVERDISCOTT & HUNTSHAW PARISH COUNCIL Vacancy for the position of Parish Clerk

The Clerk is the Proper Officer of the Council and is responsible to the Council for all aspects of administration of day-to-day business, preparing agendas and taking minutes of meetings, advising on regulatory and legal matters, and managing the Parish Councils website. The applicant must have good organisational, communication and IT skills and while it will be an advantage to hold the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA) this is not essential. The Clerk will mainly work from home and is required to attend 6 evening parish council meetings per annum (normally held bi-monthly), an Annual Parish Meeting and such other council meetings as may be decided. This is a part-time post with hours proportionate to the workload at the time. The salary would be £1,800 per annum paid on a quarterly basis, plus any expenses arising directly from the necessary activities involved.

This position may also be suitable for a Clerk to another Parish who is already processing incoming mail from DALC and District/County Councils who has hours available for additional responsibilities. From the Rector

We are at that time of year when we celebrate harvest festival. It's been a mixed year for the Owen veg patch. We've done well for beans, potatoes and courgettes, so much so that we picked up a couple of firsts at the **Beaford Autumn show!** Other crops have done less well.

It's been a difficult year in the garden. The long dry summer has meant that some of the young plants we planted out in Spring have not made it. A new hedge is just a row of dead twigs.

Psalm I says:

Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked, or stand in the way that sinners take, or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither — whatever they do prospers. (NIV translation)

Plants with deep roots are able to withstand times of drought. Those with shallow roots simply can't. The bible encourages us to root our lives deeply in God.

I'm writing this piece on the afternoon of the late queen Elizabeth's funeral. What a wonderful woman she was! What has been made clear over the 10 days since she died is just how much the Queen's life was rooted in a relationship with Jesus. Her Majesty undoubtedly faced tough times, but she remained resolutely determined to continue to love and serve and carry on. Her Lord sustained her to the end. And we trust that it is Jesus, in whom she put her trust, who has seen her through death into eternal life.

Gardening takes time, effort and care. Plants need time to mature. But investment in the end pays off. Let's make the investment of rooting our lives in a relationship with Jesus. The end result will be well worth the time, effort and care.


