****STOP PRESS Xlinks Public Meeting STOP PRESS****

There will be another public meeting at Alverdiscott Community Hall on Friday 30 June at 2pm. All are welcome.

This meeting has been arranged by Sir Jeffery Cox, who will be in the chair. There will also be representatives from Xlinks and in particular it is hoped that Simon Morrish (CEO) and David Kelly will be in attendance.

Quote from the Xlinks website - Morocco-UK Power Project - Xlinks

The Morocco - UK Power Project will be a new electricity generation facility entirely powered by solar and wind energy combined with a battery storage facility. Located in Morocco's renewable energy rich region of Guelmim Oued Noun, it will be connected exclusively to Great Britain via 3,800km HVDC sub-sea cables.

These cables will be connected into the UK National Grid via Alverdiscott Sub-Station **Two very large** HVDC/AC convertor stations will have to be built adjacent to the Sub-Station to enable this to happen.

In July we will be celebrating patronal festivals in three of our churches. On 2nd July we will celebrate the feast of St Peter (the patronal festival for Roborough and Tawstock). We'll celebrate the feast of Mary Magdalene a little early in Huntshaw on 9th July.

Both Peter and Mary Magdalene were disciples of Jesus. Both were flawed characters, yet much loved by Jesus and used greatly by him.

Peter was the brave fisherman, not afraid to go where angels feared to tread. This led to him experiencing some wonderful moments, like the time he walked on water with Jesus. But it also led to him overpromising (remember that bold assertion that he would never deny Jesus, just before he did so three times) and even experiencing a rebuke from Jesus when he told Jesus he should not be crucified.

Mary has a bad reputation, but there is no real evidence she was a prostitute... just that she was a woman afflicted by demons who Jesus took pity on and healed.

Jesus' resurrection transformed the lives of Mary and Peter. Mary was the first person to meet Jesus after he rose from the dead and was given the job of sharing the good news... remarkable given that the testimony of women was regularly disregarded at the time! Peter, a small businessman became one of the most important leaders of the early church, delivering the sermon at Pentecost which led to the conversion of 3,000 people, and writing 2 books of the bible. We believe that he went on to be crucified for his faith, refusing to give up on his commitment to his Lord.

Celebrating the lives of the saints gives us chance to see how faith in Jesus has been lived out by imperfect people just like us. Perhaps Peter and Mary encourage us that we don't have to be perfect to be a follower of Jesus... just that we need to be committed to him and love him. Perhaps they give us hope that the resurrected Jesus can empower us to do great things in his service, despite our flaws. And perhaps they encourage us to share the good news of Jesus we have experienced for ourselves.

The refurbished bells are due to be reinstalled during the week commencing Monday 16th October, and it's expected to take a week to hoist them up and rehang them. At the moment the Friends group are canvassing people to see if they'd like to come to a 'Bell viewing', on the ground, with the opportunity to take photographs etc., before they start to go up on the Monday, in which case we will endeavour to have them delivered a day or two earlier. It would be a rare chance to view the bells at ground level, in the aisles, before they are to "go up" ... for the next 500 years!

This will be on a Saturday afternoon (date to be confirmed for Oct or Nov) during which there will be the first pealing of the 3 bells for all to hear.
