A message from the Rector

Back in at the end of May, we took our campervan down to the south coast of Devon. The weather was fantastic, and we enjoyed a lovely few days away. Perhaps you are planning some time away over the summer, maybe even camping...

Camping is no new thing. In the Old Testament we read how each year the Israelites made 'booths' and camped out for a week, during a festival held to remember how their ancestors had lived in tents on a journey through the desert from Egypt to the Promised land.

It was during this journey from slavery to freedom that God instructed his people to build a special tent (Tabernacle) as a place where his glory might dwell. Friends of Huntshaw Bells All set for October! Update 2.



The refurbished bells are due to be reinstalled during the week commencing Monday 16th October, and it's expected to take a week to hoist them up and rehang them. At the moment the Friends group are canvassing people to see if they'd like to come to a 'Bell viewing', on the ground, with the opportunity to take photographs etc., before they start to go up on the Monday, in which case we will endeavour to have them delivered a day or two earlier. It would be a rare chance to view the bells at ground level, in the aisles, before they are to "go up" ... for the next 500 years!

Sadly, the Thanksgiving Service for the restoration of the bells may have to be rescheduled or may not now take place at all. Full details will appear next month, hopefully.

Although we have reached the target, donations will still be welcome (!) One of the things we would like to do is make some form of exhibition of all the bell related artifacts we have, like the medieval clappers and bell wheels etc., possibly mounted on the belfry wall, plus safety lighting up the pitch-black spiral stairway would be good to have.

So, roll on October - when maybe after 60 years - the Bells can Ring out across Huntshaw's Woods and Fields Again!
