



A message from the Rector

You may have spotted that there has been much discussion in one national newspaper about the future of the Church of England. Our neighbouring diocese of Truro has received much criticism for lumping parishes together in large groups, to the detriment, it is claimed, of parish churches.

Here in the Two Rivers we are of course a large group of 10 parishes. The reality is that neither the Church of England centrally nor our parishes individually can house and pay for a vicar for each church. It's easy to do the maths: a vicar's stipend alone is £28,000 per year. Some of our parishes have fewer than 200 residents, so that's £140 per resident per year. Then there's the cost of housing, pension, and expenses of office. Even if central funds could cover the cost of a vicar in every parish, I suspect we would rather the Church of England spent that money on schools, hospices, or even repairing the roads.

But being part of a large group is not necessarily a disadvantage for the parishes within it. Our local schools benefit greatly from being part of multi-academy trusts, in which resources are pooled and shared, admin is reduced and teachers are freed up to teach. Our vision for the Two Rivers is similar, with the central resources of our mission community used to support each parish, the people who worship in it and the wider community. The 'centre' is there to support the parishes, not the other way round. Over the last four years we've increased the number of services in most parishes, with 7 of our churches now holding weekly services and 2 others twice each month. Huntshaw church has now resumed monthly services. The number of people actively involved in church life is up.

Making a system like this work requires everyone to do their bit. We are blessed with people in each parish who can lead services on a Sunday, visit and take communion to the sick and even increasingly take funerals. They know their community well. We call them focal ministers. We are training more. Some are ordained, many are not. Some are paid, most volunteer their time freely. None work alone, but with a team from their particular parish.

October Bells for Huntshaw!



This is the month Huntshaw gets its bells back – After about 18 months of being away to get refurbished.

It was an extended visit with Taylor's because they couldn't get the work done in time for the Bat deadline of April 1st of this year – and so had to wait till the end of bat maternity season to install them.

Taylors have confirmed that they shall be arriving Monday 17th October and will take about 5 days to rehang. They will be sending their bell hanger to hoist them back into position and we have agreed to provide a rota of volunteers to help with the lifting and carrying of tools etc., just like we did when the bells were taken down for repair last year.

If you want to come and see all 3 bells, newly graphite washed and at ground level in the church before they're hoisted up the best time will be on the Monday morning (of 17th Oct).

On Sunday 19th November 2023 the Bishop of Crediton at 2pm will be leading a Service of Thanksgiving for the restoration of the bells – during which the bells will be rung out in peal for the first time. (The Bishop of Exeter was looking forward to coming but he will have retired by then).

After the service there will be refreshments in the Parish Hall to which all will be welcome.
