The heaviest was the Tenor bell weighing in at over half a ton... and took a lot of effort to haul up the tower on the continuous chain hoist. Many thanks to all those that helped on the rota to assist the bell hanger, and also to Staines Trailers for the use of their telehandler to take the bells off the delivery lorry.

The bells are currently set to chime the hour from 8am to 8pm, but there is also the facility to chime the quarters with the two smaller bell which sounds



quite nice, but people living nearby will have to choose if they want that.

A message from the Rector

The nights are drawing in and in the Owen house the season for drawing the curtains and settling down to watch a movie is upon us. The other night we watched the remake of **Whisky Galore**, the tale of a small Scottish Island during the Second World War. Disaster strikes when the island 'runs dry'- there is not a drop of whisky to be found anywhere.

Then, one foggy night, a ship laden with the spirit runs aground on the rocks off the island. The islanders are preparing to 'liberate' a few cases for themselves but are brought to a halt when the fiery parson reminds them that it is the sabbath. The 'liberation' effort must wait until the clock strikes midnight. Yet on Monday the parson is quite happy for the islanders to be about their business... and to share in their efforts, recognising the "provision" of the Lord!

The film is full of warmth and humour. Members of the small community accept each other, foibles and all – and there are many foibles to make the viewer smile! They worked together, played together and faced their challenges together.

Whilst not wishing to be legalistic about keeping one day holy to the Lord, I do think we were better off as a society when one day in seven we rested from our labours and spent time with God, with family and with community. As humans we are not designed to be on the go 24/7.

But the thing that really struck me in the film was the simple faith of some of the characters; the young woman kneeling by her bed asking God to give her fiancé the courage to stand up to his overbearing mother and go through with their marriage. Might we sometimes overcomplicate life? Might we sometimes need to just share our thoughts and prayers with God, trusting that he loves us and cares for us?

Patient was released to Outpatient department without dressing.


I have suggested that he loosen his pants before standing, and then when he stands with the help of his wife they should fall to the floor.
