From the Rector

Not long before his crucifixion, a group of people approached one of Jesus' disciples and asked if they might 'see' Jesus. Jesus took the opportunity to teach about his impending death on the cross, when he would be 'lifted up' and 'glorified'. You can read the story in the bible, in John 12. 20-33.

Crucifixion was designed by the Romans to be the ultimate in suffering and shame. And yet, it is as Jesus is lifted up on a cross, that Jesus can be seen for who he truly is... the divine Son of God who loved us humans to the end, dying a death we deserve that we might receive the life he gives. It is as Jesus is lifted up on the cross that he is glorified... an instrument of torture becoming a throne of love. If we want to 'see' Jesus for who he truly is, then we need to look up to the cross.

Wonderful though the cross was, if that had been the end of Jesus, then what a sorry tale it would have been. But it was not. Three days later Jesus rose from the dead. Forty days after that, the ascended to another throne; this one in heaven at the right hand of God the Father.

The conviction of those who have chosen to follow Jesus and be known as his, is that Jesus is alive today. He stands at the door of each and every life, and when we open the door of our lives, he comes in. We need never be alone again.

I still occasionally meet people who aren't sure if they would be welcome to a church service. And just occasionally I meet people who aren't sure, if they came, what they should wear, or what they would need to do. I'd like to assure everyone that they are welcome in any of our churches. There are no rules about what you have to wear. You don't even need to 'do' anything; you're welcome to just sit in the back pew and watch (as long as there's not someone there already — back pews are very popular!). If you want to 'see' Jesus, then come. If you've never met him, we'd love to introduce you. And if you haven't spoken to him in a while, we'd love to help you get reacquainted.
