Dilemma

There are many Jews amongst people I greatly admire. Daniel Barenboim together with his Palestinian friend Edward Said founded the youth orchestra (West-Eastern Divan Orchestra) that brings together young people from different nationalities, especially Jewish and Palestinian, to make music together and so develop friendships across the barriers.

I also admire Jacob Epstein, the sculptor who designed the image of St. Michael defeating the devil, on the wall of Coventry cathedral.

I admire heroes who survived the Holocaust, as well as those who died in the concentration camps and gas chambers, sometimes with great self-sacrifice for the sake of others.

And, of course, Jesus Christ, whom I regard as the greatest religious and moral teacher, humanity has ever known. I am not anti-Jewish.

But I am confused by the attitude of Benjamin Netanyahu. Yes, the attack by Hamas on the Jewish communities on October 7th was an atrociously wicked event, but the Jews are the people of the Old Testament. Their prophets set the ethical standards that have so influenced the whole world that they are the basis of many international laws. "An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth" was designed to limit retaliation not increase it. (Exodus 21 v23). The prophets fought for justice, the defence of the weak, equality for the poor. "What does the Lord require of you? To act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6 v8) "Let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never failing stream! (Amos 5 v24). "He {the God of Jacob} will judge between many peoples and will settle disputes for strong nations far and wide. They will beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war any more." (Micah 4 v3)

From the Rector

On Sunday 23rd June our curate, Rev Ally Hope will be ordained priest by the bishop of Crediton at a service in St Giles Church. Ally has been with us now for a year, focusing largely on Beaford. For the remaining two years of her curacy we plan to get her around the mission community more, in preparation for taking on the role of vicar or rector in another mission community.

The Sunday afterwards, in Atherington, we will be holding a service to mark Rev Julia completing her curacy and licensing as a fully qualified deacon in our group of parishes. Julia is a familiar face around the mission community, having worked for many years as our parish nurse, supporting parents at toddler groups, and supporting the elderly, sick and terminally ill. She will combine her role of parish nurse and deacon.

Everyone from our villages is welcome to join in these celebratory services.

As we celebrate Ally's ordination and Julia's licensing, I wanted to pay tribute to, and say thank you to, everyone who works so hard to keep our churches open and ministering. St Paul compares the church to a body, with each part contributing to the whole and enabling the body to function well. Some parts are more visible, others less so; but all are important. In his letter to the Ephesians, St Paul writes, "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do".

Church works best when everyone plays their part, whether it's preaching the sermon, or fixing the church roof so that people can sit and listen in the dry! So, thank you to all of you who are doing your bit... and if you feel you have something to offer that we are not making the most of, please get in touch... we'd love to hear from you!
