

From The Assistant Editor

Welcome to the May Local Rag.

The talk at the Garden Club meeting, by Alison and Stuart was really very interesting and informative. One of the subjects it brought to our attention was the potential problems that may come from the continued invasion of the UK by the Asian Hornet.

This voracious predator presents a real danger to our native bees which are already under a lot of pressure from pesticides and climate change. The Asian Hornet has already become a problem across much of Europe and has also made its way to the Channel Islands. They've also been seen in Plymouth, and other parts of the UK. A report from the Channel Islands said, "The full impact on native ecology is not fully known at the moment, but individual bee

keepers can certainly testify to the dire effect of Asian hornets."

"The most dangerous time in terms of numbers is September/October but in late May/early June the nests will contain worker hornets who will defend the nest if it is disturbed."

Huntshaw village hall is 100 hundred years old!


It was built in 1924 on land donated by the then

From the Rector


Garden Club
