

As August draws to a close and the new school term begins, my thoughts are drawn towards all the children and young people who are headed back to school, and all the adults who will be working with them.

As a mum, I have known the ups and downs of the summer holidays, the freedom of not having our days bookended by school runs, not having to complete homework in the evenings, not having to prepare yet another packed lunch, and not having to wait around at another after school club. I have known the joy of getting to know my children when they are more relaxed, not so tired from full days at school. I have also known the frustrations of finding fun activities to fill our time, juggling childcare so that I could work, and the added expense of taking the children out on day trips. I have also had the opportunity to practice patience and peace keeping skills when my two daughters have argued more due to being in each other's company for extended periods of time.



ADVENTURES WITH ROAD CLOSURES

The other day, we had to drive over to Devizes (that's a town in Wiltshire). According to the AA route map, this journey should take two and three quarter hours.

We set out with the knowledge that the Newton Tracey road was closed, as was the bridge at Umberleigh, so we decided that we would not go via South Molton, but continue straight on and join the link road at Tiverton instead.

The road though Chawleigh had fortunately just been re-opened, but three miles from Tiverton there was again a full road closure!

We eventually arrived at the A303/A39 junction at Podimore. We wanted the A39, which was again fortunate, as the road works on that section of the A303 were severely restricting the traffic flow which had led to a two mile queue on to the junction. Of course there were further diversions along the A39, and we eventually arrived in Devizes three and a half hours later.

My lady wife, who knows about these things, suggested that we return by the M4 and M5. This was going well until ten miles along the M4 we slowed to a crawl (cause unknown), and did not clear again until shortly before the M5 interchange. This led us into a false sense of security, and we soon started crawling again!

This however was not entirely unexpected, as the traffic around Bristol (that's another town to the east of here) is almost always very heavy, but continued all the way to Avonmouth, shortly after which there had some time previously been an accident, which always slows the traffic flow.

Having negotiated this, the speeds miraculously increased back to normal, apart from when vehicles had to negotiate the obligatory camper vans in the middle lane! (Have you noticed that since the implementation of middle lane driving on motorways as a motoring offence, it has increased??)


This route home via the motorways, bearing in mind that we once again had to avoid

****Stop Press Stop Press****

Terrible news from Merseyside earlier. The Birkenhead tunnel has been closed and the speed limit will be 25mph for the foreseeable future. The highways agency found over 200 dead crows on the tunnel approach recently, and there was concern that they may have died from Avian Flu.

A pathologist examined the remains of the crows, and has confirmed that the problem was NOT Avian Flu but rather the cause of death appeared to be from vehicular impacts.

However, during the analysis it was noted that varying colours of paints appeared on the beaks and claws. By analysing these paints it was found that 98% of the crows had been killed by impacts with lorries, whilst only 2% were killed by cars.

The agency then hired an Ornithological Behaviourist to determine if there was a cause for the disproportionate percentage of truck kills versus cars.

The Ornithological Behaviourist quickly concluded that when crows eat road kill, they always have a lookout to warn of danger.

They soon realised that, while all the lookout crows could shout "cah, cah", not a single one could say "lorry, lorry"...
