halves would take much longer to complete and we thought that given only a few properties were along this route that was the best option. However, we take on board the comments from the residents and in future we will engage the CLO on sites such as this to ensure residents are kept fully up to date on a daily basis on the work being undertaken.

I am advised that the gang were not working on both sides at the same time and therefore the official diversion route was available for use and the use of Forde Lane was only an additional option and done so at the residents own risk. Again, we take on board the comments from the residents and in future will ensure alternative routes that are likely to be used by locals, are inspected and the landowner contacted. Please note it is the responsibility of the landowner to maintain their hedges throughout the year not DCC.

I will do everything I can to ensure this does not happen again in the future."

But in the first week of November Taylors are due to return to install the remaining 2 clappers and ropes into the 'empty' bells.



As previously advised, consultation was undertaken for this site. Two weeks prior to the works starting, letters were sent out to all the residents, as a result of this letter several phone calls were made from residents and the contractor explained how they would gain access to their properties. A few of them were even spoken to by the Agent when the road was marked out. However in hindsight this site should have been referred to our Customer Liaison Officer (CLO) to ensure a higher level of consultation was available, something we will address in the future.

It is normal practice to plane out the damaged areas ready for treatment throughout the whole stretch of road to be treated, the reason for this is to save time and money and cause less disruption to the public. As I understand, over the weekends, sections deeper than our safety defect measurements were not left open. For the work to be carried out in 2

### HUNTSHAW Road Works Update

During the recent roadworks, in the Huntshaw area, I have received a lot of emails from people who were unhappy, particularly, and understandably, those in Guscott. I had various conversations with our neighbourhood highways officers manager, as she had the overview. In turn, I know she has gone back several times to the contractor, at my request, as I was not satisfied with the answers they were giving. Below is what she has sent to me, and it sounds as if some lessons have been learned. From my point of view, it all seemed to go downhill when the agent, Scott, went on holiday without leaving a named person for residents to speak to. Graham White.

### Highways said:-

"I have spoken at length with the contractor regarding the various issues that have come up from the residents for this site. It is very unfortunate that the works here have caused so much upset to the local community, something we very much regret and wish to avoid in the future.

I can advise that although it may have appeared that emergency access was not maintained, in the event of an emergency vehicle requiring access then the work gang would have allowed them through, I understand there was no incident that required this access.
