From the Rector

A recent survey conducted by YouGov on behalf of the Bible Society has turned up a surprising result: the percentage of the UK population attending church has risen significantly over the last 6 years, so that 12% of the population claims to attend church at least once per month. The biggest driver in this quiet revival is an increase from 4% to 16% amongst younger people (Gen Z - born between 1997 and 2012). The survey of 13,000 people noted that the desire for community was a key factor in this growth in church-going, that people who attended church were engaging in more spiritual practices than previously, and that people who attended church experienced a higher level of mental wellbeing. Church is also becoming more diverse.

Now, this survey may prove to be inaccurate, or to have just highlighted a flash in the pan. Or it may have captured a move of God which is quietly taking place in our country. Only time will tell. But I do think that perhaps it gives the lie to the tired, old, narrative that church is just for "old" people and that when this generation passes away, so will the church. Maybe younger people, in the midst of all the uncertainties and troubles of this world, are looking to God in a search for deeper meaning, connection and purpose. Maybe in God they are finding it!

If I am honest, our little churches across the mission community are struggling to keep up with all the requirements of keeping the "institution" of the church afloat... and to maintain on behalf of the community, historic buildings and church-yards. We are doing our best, and hopefully as more people join our churches there will be more people willing to help with practical tasks. Should there be a revival in the spiritual life of our nation I want our churches to be open, and ready to support those seeking ultimate meaning and truth. But of one thing I am certain, God still loves the people of this nation, and our little communities here in north Devon. Jesus, the good shepherd, is still going out to seek and save the lost. And Jesus' promise still holds true, ""Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." (Matthew 7.7-8, NIV translation).

News from Huntshaw Church


