





I am sure you will be aware of two more "net zero" projects in the area - a battery energy storage system at Gammaton, and yet another solar farm at Bulworthy.

There are no current (pardon the pun) regulations or standards for battery storage. Many scientists have stated that the Accident Hazards regulations should apply to these installations, due to the toxic chemicals given off in the event of a fire (not an unheard of occurrence). However the Health & Safety Executive disagrees - Why?

The proposed solar farm at Bulworthy is in close proximity to both the Gammaton and Litchardon Cross sites, and will take out yet more farmland from the area.

The recent application for another solar farm at Ebberley Hill has been allowed on appeal to the Planning Inspectorate, despite objections from residents and Torridge Council. The inspector allowed this, despite noting that it would "introduce uncharacteristic and industrial development over a relatively large area" and would also lead to a loss of grade 3A farmland. The outlook is not good for any objections to the two current applications.

The whole North Devon area is becoming covered in wind and solar farms, which do not necessarily deliver their promised output. The companies involved are also not always soundly funded. The Derril Water solar farm owners, Ripple Energy, have just gone into administration, so what happens now?

Further food for thought – I quote from the latest CPRE magazine – "it is worth remembering that 97% of all carbon emissions are natural, coming mostly from the oceans, plant decay and volcanoes". It is also interesting to note that the oftquoted 1.5 degrees temperature rise has no particular environmental basis and is in fact based on temperatures existing during the Little Ice Age hundreds of years ago.

The government is obsessed with meeting a net zero emissions target, which on our tiny island will be virtually meaningless on a global basis. So much for local democracy.....


