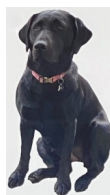

In Response

Further to the articles by Mr Graham White, Parish Council Chairperson, in the July and August issues of the Rag, I'd like to point out that parish councillors have a dual role. One: they represent the views and concerns of the residents of the parish to the parish council itself and, through it, to the district, county or unitary authority. Two: they report back to residents on issues affecting the parish. It is not a political appointment, nor does the role involve furthering one's own opinions.

As such it is disturbing to see Mr White promoting his personal feelings in the Rag under the Alverdiscott and Huntsraw Parish Council banner. His views do not reflect those of everyone in our parish. Other people are horrified to have a Reform Party County Councillor. They support the X-Links project, are not climate change deniers, and believe a 20mph limit is wise bearing in mind our lethal rural roads - because every blind bend and summit could conceal a child on a horse, a pedestrian, livestock, workers or wildlife.

Our Public Servants must reflect Parishioners' varying opinions, not their own. **Kate Goldstone.**
