NORTH DEVON QUIZ PART TWO - THE ANSWERS.

- I Baron Claude Patrice Bourget, Lord of Horwood lives in Provence, but occasionally visits Horwood.
- 2 Barnstaple Town, Barnstaple Quay, Barnstaple Victoria Road and Barnstaple Junction.
- 3 It was owned by Babcock Marine Appledore from 2007 to 2018.
- 4 The Vikings who died in the Battle of Bloody Corner.
- 5 (B3232) Main road from Barnstaple to Great Torrington: Belladown Hill up to Newton Tracey and Bartridge Hill up to Alverdiscott.
- 6 It was known as the Athenaeum and was a Library and a Gentleman's Club.
- 7 Henry Williamson was the author of 'Tarka the Otter,' Salar the Salmon' and many other books. He lived in Georgeham, where he is buried
- 8 HMHS Glenart Castle was sunk off Hartland Point. A memorial stone stands near the spot.
- 9 Verity is the name of the huge (10 inches taller than the 'Angel of the North') statue created by Damien Hirst in 2012, which stands on the pier at the entrance to the harbour in Ilfracombe. It has been loaned to the town for 20 years. Verity means truth and Hirst describes his work as a, "modern allegory of truth and justice."
- 10 These surreal tall structures are in fact, Victorian sewage ventilation pipes to allow the noxious gases to escape from the underground sewers. The four trumpet-like openings are the vents and the arrow is not a wind-vane; it signifies the direction of flow of the underground sewage.
- 11 Poet and playwright John Gay was born in Barnstaple to an aristocratic though impoverished family. The Beggar's Opera (1728) was a great success and was a satire of the then prime minister Sir Robert Walpole. Details of Gay's life and work adorn the walls of the pub in town, 'The Panniers.'

A Brief Summary of Sir Geoffrey Cox's Surgery

The MP for Torridge held a surgery on 19th September which mainly focussed on the planning application for Bulworthy Farm.

A presentation was given by the Action Group on behalf of the audience, which numbered around 60 residents of all three affected parishes. This was a concise outline of the main objections to the plan, and Sir Geoffrey was sympathetic to the views put forward.

In his answer to this presentation, and subsequent detailed questions, he announced that he would be placing his own objection on the planning portal. This was despite his being an MP, which would normally preclude this course of action. He stated that as this was part of a much wider subject affecting the nation as a whole, he was therefore able to proceed with this action.

He would also be meeting with Devon Highways and the Torridge planning authority regarding several contentious aspects of the proposal, including road access and safety, and the high probability that once built, there would not in fact be any connection to the National Grid due to capacity constraints at the Alverdiscott substation.

He quoted Professor James Lovelock (he of the Gaia hypothesis) who said that solar arrays were "an irrelevance" in terms of reliable future power supply, and also expressed concern that the democratic process was being overridden by the government in pursuit of an ideological commitment to net zero.

He emphasised that comments on the application must keep to the established planning parameters in order to be taken into account.

In conclusion, he promised to come back to the parish in 2-3 months after having talked to all parties, including the developers, and gathered more detailed information on the project. It was highly unlikely that any joint meeting between Torridge and North Devon would take place before at least the New Year.

BULWORTHY SOLAR FARM MEETING A SHORT SUMMARY

The public open meeting held on Thursday Sept 4th was well attended, with approximately 90 residents of the three parishes of Horwood, Lovacott & Newton Tracey, Westleigh and Alverdiscott & Huntshaw turning up, together with county and district councillors.

Penny Mills and Steve Crowther gave a joint presentation, not only on solar farms in general, but also guidance on what could and could not be considered in a planning response.

They pointed out that the application in respect of Bulworthy Farm was considerably lacking in detail with respect to several aspects of the project, and also that the battery storage did not appear to be connected in any way to the solar farm. It should therefore be treated as a separate application.

It should be remembered that any decision on the solar farm would be specifically for its construction, without any consideration of whether or not it could be connected to the National Grid. This at present is unlikely, as it was established several years ago that the substation at Alverdiscott is unable to accept much additional capacity, and that this situation is unlikely to be resolved until the Grid finalise their upgrade plans in the next few years. This implies that if the farm were to be built, it would simply sit there doing nothing apart from potentially increasing the market value of the land.

While not relevant to any planning approval, it was also pointed out that the government is currently paying millions of pounds annually to solar and wind farm owners not to produce power at certain times, as this would overload the grid network. With the national total of power produced being 120% of the nation's requirements, and virtually all new homes being required to have solar panels installed, the question arises as to whether this farm is needed at all.

Farmers are regularly being bombarded with offers from installers to put solar farms on the land; many of these firms are one-man bands jumping on the bandwagon without having the necessary financial backing to proceed. There have been several instances where such companies have gone bust, leaving half completed projects.

Following the meeting, a WhatsApp group has been set up under the name of Bulworthy Solar Action Group. Their first formal meeting was held on 11th September. It is also likely that a Facebook group and a website will be set up.

By the time you read this, Sir Geoffrey Cox will have held his surgery on 19th September, at which he was apprised of the situation and the progress so far by representatives of the action group. See p11 for a summary of this event.






